Teachers grading papers

This week we teachers are busy checking students' exam papers and preparing lessons for the second term. I will teach two subjects next year. Most students have no difficulty in their studies, but a few students who came from remote rural areas have very little English knowledge, and they have to study harder than the others in their English and Bible courses. Although we have English classes the whole first year, some of them are slow in improvement.

All senior students teach Sunday school

Every Sunday all senior students have an assignment to teach Sunday school in seven different places. Most of the places are home churches. Two are in Buddhist villages and one is in a Hindu village. The students travel almost 20 miles by bicycle and train to these home churches. Our base is at the only native Christian family we have, and we take chances when we teach and evangelize to non-Christian young people. At the same time we try to build friendships with their parents and the villagers. We hope in the near future that the non-Christian young people and their parents will join us in fellowship and Christian meetings.

MBI to host Christian Convention

Our church and MBI will be the hosts for Lower Myanmar Christian Convention (Church of Christ) which will be held in Pyin Oo Lwin from December first to the third. We estimate that about 500 people from several parts of the central and lower country will come to the convention. Now we are in process of preparing for that meeting. The women's group and the youth of our church are trying to raise funds for the convention in any possible way they can. Please pray for our preparations and that we get permission from our local authorities.

My wife Khono and I badly miss each one of you and your country, because it was this season last year that we visited your country and we had such a wonderful fellowship with all of you. May God continue to bless you as you dedicate in His service
